Invaluable **Benefits** of Attendance

The National Child Nutrition Conference features the best educational training and networking opportunities for CACFP, Afterschool Meals and Summer Food. Below are the invaluable benefits to note when calculating the return on investment.



Continuing Education Units

NCA allots CEU credit for attendance at conference workshops. These are recognized by the NCA's CACFP Certification Program. A

Certificate of Training Participation is awarded to attendees listing the total hours earned. Onsite attendees will be able to earn up to 31 hours of CEUs, and virtual attendees can earn up to 17 hours of CEUs. Additionally, Onsite attendees can add up to 12 more CEUs by pre-registering for preconference and postconference training academies. Traditionally, the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics will also award CEUs.



Networking Opportunities

Networking is one of the most valued benefits of attending a national conference with fellow child nutrition community professionals. With

over 2,000 attendees, NCA helps facilitate that right from the start by hosting networking sessions and a reception on Tuesday. Meet your neighbors and collaborate on operations, talk about lessons learned, share stories, and revisit main messages from the conference.



Attendees gain access to national and local nonprofits and vendors in the exhibit hall. Attendees can interact with the organizations
